

BIOGRAPHY

Anton Theophilus Boisen: born October 29, 1876; died October 2, 1965; Bachelor of Arts from Indiana University, 1897; Master in Forestry, Yale University, 1905; Bachelor of Divinity, Union Theological Seminary, NY, 1911; Master of Arts from Harvard University, 1923; Doctor of Divinity, (Honorary), Washburn College, 1938; Doctor of Letters (Honorary Chicago Theological Seminary 1957), Chaplain and Supervisor, Worcester State Hospital, 1924-1931; Lecturer and Research Associate at Chicago Theological Seminary, 1926-1942; Instructor at Boston University School of Theology, 1925 to 1930; Chaplain and Supervisor, Elgin State Hospital, 1932 to 1954, Earl Lecturer, Pacific School of Religion, Berkeley, CA, 1942-43. PROCESSING

When the IAUP-MC/CSRCFPR acquired the Anton T. Boisen reprints of papers and unedited documents, an attempt was made to maintain the original order. Folded materials were flattened. Staples, rubber bands, and metal clips were removed and replaced with plastic clips. All materials were placed in acid-free folders and boxes.

The pristine quality of the documents allowed for the best digitalization possible. Most of the documents have been formatted into PDF black and white digital documents. Only documents containing color pictures or cover pages have been digitalized in color. When necessary, the documents were digitally restored by erasing many of the ink-spots and other markings at the edges of the paper. Also, digital restoration has taken place inside the text of the document, without altering the contents of the documents. No digital edition or corrections of the written text have been performed.

For the purposes of the internet, the documents have been placed in a Thematic Index, as follows:

The internet Thematic Index correlates with CTS Library index. The Thematic Index employs the CTS Library code numbers, so that the folders can be located at the CTS Library.
