STATE TEES MEET

First Delegates Arrive in City For EUB Session

Delegates and visitors began arriving here today for the opening tomorrow of the world conference of the Evangelical United Brethren Church.

A number of preparatory sessions were under way today, and heads of 19 local committees will meet with the top planners tomorrow morning prior to the opening session at 1:30 p.m. in Scottish Rite Cathedral.

Dr. L. L. Huffman, publisher of the Otterbein Press, Dayton, Ohio, general conference chairman, conferred today with Bishop George Edward Epp, resident bishop, and the Rev. Dr. Harry L. Zechman, head of the local conference committee.

ALSO MEETING again today was the council of Administration, in session at the Harris Street EUB Church. The 55 members of the denomination's top policy-making organization were considering matters of administration, budget and recommendations from the annual conference that are to be presented before the convention.

The budget and finance committee, meanwhile, has announced it is asking a 30 per cent increase in budget to meet the growing needs for support of the church's world-wide activities.

Dr. Cawley Stine, formerly of Harrisburg and now church treasurer and the Rev. Dr. Ralph M. Holdeman, executive secretary of the Board of Evangelism, all of Dayton.

Charles Cornelius, manager of the Evangelical Press book store, is chairman of the committee on building arrangements, and is assigning rooms for the general con-
